The Visit to Canada of Pope Francis

The Bishops of Canada are grate that Pope Francis has accepted their invitation to visit Canada on a historic pilgrimage of healing and reconciliation. We expect this visit to build on three years of constructive dialogue between the Canadian Bishops, the Holy See, and Indigenous peoples who have generously shared their

experiences and stories about the suffering and challenges that continue to this day. After collectively and unequivocally apologizing for the

Catholic Church's role in the residential school system this past September, discussions between the Canadian Bishops and the Holy See have continued.

The President and past-President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops recently met in Rome with the Secretary of State of the Holy See to discuss the next steps on the reconciliation journey.

The Pope was moved by the profound desire of the Bishops of Canada and the Indigenous Peoples for him to come to Canada on a pilgrimage of healing and reconciliation.

Following this meeting, the Pope has accepted the invitation from the Canadian Bishops to visit Canada. Details will be announced by the CCCB as they are confirmed.

More immediately, the Indigenous delegation to the Vatican in December will allow the Pope to hear directly from Indigenous people on the historic and ongoing legacy of residential schools, and discuss with them their hopes for the visit in service of ongoing reconciliation.

Archdiocese of Grouard-McLennan Pilgrimage of St. Joseph

We have three churches in our archdiocese dedicated to St. Joseph: in Spirit River, Grande Prairie and John D'Or Prairie (in the Little Red River Cree Nation). You are encouraged as a whole family or individual to make a pilgrimage to these churches. Because churches are usually locked, you'll need to register the date and approximate time of your visit to any of these churches. At any of these churches, you can pick up a "pilgrimage passport". In your passport you will find a series of reflections and prayers focused on the sorrows and joys of St. Joseph. You are welcome over the year to visit each of the three churches and pray the devotions and get your passport stamped at that church. When you have visited all three churches you need to go the Chancery Office in Grande Prairie. There you need to present your passport and you will be given an olive-wood crucifix made by Christians in the Holy Land, as a memento of your pilgrimage.
