# Archdiocese of Grouard-McLennan

Dear Pastors and Parishioners of the Archdiocese,

It does not seem that this COVID Pandemic will be disappearing from the world any time soon, at least not in the same way that it came into the world. How many other variants will we face before the threat of contracting this virus will subside?

<u>Proof of vaccination</u> Rest assured that we will not be asking any person entering our churches to show a proof of vaccination or prevent them from participating at Mass, be it on Sunday or on a weekday, unless at some point in time, the Province demands it. Only then will we have to decide how we proceed.

<u>COVID symptoms</u> If you are showing symptoms related to Covid 19, we ask that you stay home until these symptoms clear. Many Rapid Home Covid Test kits give a negative result at first, but I have heard that some of these rapid tests will show negative at first but after a few hours will display a positive test result. It is best to hold on to your test strip and verify its reading after a couple hours of a negative test.

The Provincial guideline for public gatherings has not changed. Let me remind everyone that;

#### Masks are mandatory:

- <u>in all indoor public spaces, workplaces and places of worship</u>, including eligible businesses that implement the Restriction Exemption Program
- for employees in all indoor work settings, except while alone in work station

Concerns

Here at the chancery, we have been receiving letters and emails of concern because individuals present at churches remove their facemask during the celebration of the Mass. They sing and respond audibly to the parts of the Mass that are said in common, like the "I Confess", the response to the Psalm, the Creed, etc. We do want 'full, active, participation' from the faithful. We also want everyone to be responsible for each other. We ask that face masks be worn at all times except for consuming Holy Communion.

<u>Source of Contention</u> It is understandable that there is disagreements and discontentment and varying views around COVID and restriction and rules imposed because of this pandemic. We ask that when it comes to the celebration of the Mass and to our Christian gatherings, we do so with charity and concern for one another.

Let me remind everyone of the last directives that were sent out on November 26, 2021. These are still in effect.

1. In-person attendance for worship services remains limited to 1/3 of fire code occupancy. The pastor is not counted towards this capacity limit.

- 2. All attendees at a place of worship must maintain 2 metres' distance at all times from people who are not part of their household.
- 3. Attendees are required to mask in all indoor public places and indoor workplaces unless they qualify for an exception.
- 4. Congregants must not attend in person if they are experiencing the most common symptoms of COVID-19 (cough, fever, shortness of breath, runny nose, or sore throat).
- 5. Faith leaders and other speakers may remove their masks while speaking if there is a distance of 2 metres between the speaking location and other congregants. The speaker must put their mask back on once finished speaking.
- 6. Faith leaders and speakers must follow hand hygiene measures when removing and donning their masks.
- 7. Place hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol in locations throughout the place of worship.
- 8. Enhance cleaning and disinfecting practices as described in the General Operational Guidance must continue to be followed.
- 9. Outdoor in-person religious services must follow public outdoor gathering restrictions (up to 150 attendees with 2 metres' distance between households.) ie: weddings & funerals.
- 10. For indoor <u>weddings</u> and <u>funerals</u>, Provincial guidelines apply: a limit of 50 attendees or 50% of fire code capacity, whichever is less.

### B: Relaxed and permitted

- 1. A procession with cross-bearer, 2 candles-bearers, the Book of Gospels, and presider. Masked and keeping 2 metre distance between participants.
- 2. Congregational singing will be allowed but masks must be worn over mouth and nose while singing.
- 3. Song leader, choir members and cantor must practice 2 metre distance between participants and continue to be masked while singing. Sharing of microphones is discouraged.
- 4. Wind instruments are not permitted.
- 5. On reaching the sanctuary, altar servers are to keep 2 metre distance from each other. They do not serve as acolytes at the altar.
- 6. Holy water may be placed in fonts for use but should be changed after every liturgy.
- 7. Reception of communion of the Precious Blood is limited to the celebrant and concelebrants (using individual chalices or by intinction).
- 8. A recessional procession following the same order as the entrance procession is permitted.
- 9. Proper sanitation of cross and candles is to be observed.
- 10. Sanitization of spaces where people have been: pews, kneelers, ambo, door handles, etc.
